### Vicar's Reflections

This past month our Church celebrated the feast of the Ascension. When asked what that feast day represents, one person whimsically stated, It's the

day when Jesus started to work from home.” Before he left this world, he gave us a glimpse of his work project. He said, “I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also.” <sup>1</sup>

As many of you know, I, too, work from home. Being at home has given me time to work in the yard and be in a place where I plant seeds and water plants. For me, just being outside is therapeutic. It’s also an easy place for me to pray, as all around me are object lessons and reminders that the garden of my heart also needs attention. It is in such a place that the parable of the Sower and Seed comes alive, and I find myself asking the Lord to clear out of my heart everything that might hinder fruitfulness. Jesus said, “I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should remain.” <sup>2</sup> And so as we think about the meaning of Ascension Day, let’s not forget that Jesus is at the right of the Father, interceding for each of us so that we will fulfill that very purpose.

On two separate Saturdays in May, St MM men worked to construct a 10X10 wooden deck on the back of Deacon Tally Bandy’s home in Whispering

Pines. The many-talented, willing-workers secured a permit, purchased supplies, and gathered to build the addition.

Early in May, Kim Doolittle, Guy Standing and David Poisson cleared the space and set the base for the deck. Two weeks later the second group, Bob Rinaldi, Fr. Stephen and Jim Douglass, came with hammers and saws and installed the platform. David and Julia Poisson came later to install a handrail, and Jessie added the final touch, chairs and flowers.

### **QUILTS BECOME OUTREACH PROJECT**

The women of St. MM are now creating small lap quilts, called “Fidget Quilts” for the residents at Seven Lakes Assisted Living and Memory Care. These colorful quilts, heavily adorned with textures such as buttons, flaps, pockets and zippers are designed to provide stimulation for the fidgeting hands of memory loss patients. These therapeutic quilts offer comfort as they keep the hands busy.
