

A Message from the Vicar

Reflections on Joy: I will never forget the joy I had when I first fell in love with Ellen. It was a time when every expression of love brought with it fullness and satisfaction. I never felt more fully alive. But like every human experience, we have had to work on keeping that love alive and growing. Therefore, each day, I try to do at least one thing to make my wife's life a little easier and better. Most often, it doesn't seem like much, but those acts of thoughtful kindness are meaningful, and they make a big difference.

I think the Apostle John had something like this in mind when he wrote his first epistle and included in his opening, "We write these things to make our joy complete" (1 John 1:9). The joy he speaks about is a fruit of the Spirit. Fruit is something that often comes with careful cultivation, forethought, and diligence. It happens in our lives spiritually when we take the time to be mindful of God's presence or when we take the time to let him speak to our hearts and strengthen our faith. But this joy is also perfected and made complete as we live in community and experience God's love together.

When John speaks about making our joy complete, he uses a word that is also translated, "to fill up."¹ It depicts a life that is abundant and full. So let's do our part to allow this joy to overflow in small expressions of love as we serve the Lord with gladness each and every day.
