Vicar's Reflections

"And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light."

Romans 13: 11-12

This admonishment from Paul's letter to the Romans is as relevant today as it has ever been. One reason for this is the loss that has come from not being together, and without that we can easily drift into spiritual slumber.

This tendency reminds me of a story about a German bank employee who was in the middle of transferring 62.40 euros from a customer's bank account when he accidentally took a power nap at his desk. Unfortunately, he dozed off while his finger was on the "2" key, resulting in a 222 million euro (300 million dollars) transfer into the customer's account. The fallout from the mistake included the firing of the employee's colleague who verified the transfer.

Paul tells us that we, too, can make costly mistakes if we don't stay awake spiritually. So let us "put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light" as we watch and pray and expect God to do great things in and through each of us.
