Message from our Vicar

One of my favorite childhood games involved my brother and me spinning round and round then seeing which one could be first to reach a designated spot such as a tree or a pole. Often we were so dizzy from the experience we could hardly stand up. I later learned that one of the tricks to maintaining balance is to focus on a single point as you make a full spin.

As I reflect on the experience, it seems that we all face twists and turns in life that tend to throw us off balance. During such times a reference point outside of ourselves is needed in our Christian journey. That reference point is Christ. He is the rock of our salvation on which we build our trust.

It has been a custom of the Church to use the season of Lent, which begins on Wednesday, March 2nd, to reconnect us to the reference points that lead us to Him. I hope you will join us for the Thursday night Lenten series which starts on March 10th, when we will be talking more about those reference points.
