

FROM THE VICAR

The Church calendar year was designed to impart spiritual balance as it reinforces major themes in salvation history. Church seasons function much like Israel's feast days that reminded its citizens of everything that God had done for them. This memory was the basis of their worship and was the cause for great rejoicing. The Psalmist David exclaimed, "May all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you! May those who love your salvation say evermore, 'The LORD is great!'"¹

Due to the presence of sin there were sub-themes in their worship, sometimes somber in tone. Israel had the Day of Atonement. Liturgical churches today have the Season of Lent, emphasizing repentance.

Throughout our lives, there is "a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance."² Feeling sorrow for one's sin, along with rejoicing in God's loving kindness, brings wholeness. Both take time to develop. Soul-searching and repentance are difficult, but in the end, they are gifts.

Therefore, let's not neglect this aspect of spiritual discipline as we prepare for a Holy Lent. Let's allow ourselves time for God to bring healing and wholeness to all areas of our lives.
