

THOUGHTS FROM OUR VICAR

The following quote from Tish Harrison Warren was written in the religious section of the New York Times on April 16th and passed on to me by John Sapp: “The season of Easter is a 50-day period of joy and celebration. During this time, Christians around the globe celebrate and proclaim that Jesus physically rose from the dead, not as a spirit but in a body — one marked with scar tissue and freckles, one that ate and drank, one that, though transformed, was still recognizable, touchable and palpable. Christians believe that when Jesus rose, he walked on hard earth and ate fish caught from real, salty seas. This resurrected body points to the ultimate destiny of humanity. It says that we will not float away to some faraway heaven but that eternity will (one day) be found right here on earth, in what the Bible calls “a new heaven and a new earth.”¹

The resurrection of Jesus that the apostles proclaimed was something they had “seen with their own eyes, looked at, and their hands had touched.”² It was so real that they risked their lives, were persecuted, beaten, and suffered hardships of every kind. They even surrendered their lives to death so that the message of our Lord’s resurrection would be faithfully proclaimed. Therefore “let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering,”³ for in a future coming day, our faith will be sight.
