Stewardship Sunday

Stewardship Sunday will be celebrated November 12, with a potluck brunch following the morning worship service. Sign-up sheets are on the round table near the front door.

Stewardship letters have been prepared, and parishioners may pick them up with their pledge cards found on the round table in the narthex. Those that are not picked up will be mailed to residences. Signed pledge cards may be mailed to St. MM, placed in the offering plate, or placed in the large envelope marked PLEDGES. (on the round table)

Treasurer David Poison will use the pledge cards as a guide in developing a budget, and only he will have access to them.

A Message from the Vicar The Importance of Giving Thanks

At the opening of the Eucharistic Prayer, the celebrant begins with a dialogue that calls us to "Lift up our hearts."ⁱ The series of phrases used is generally called by its Latin name *sercum corda* (literally meaning "elevate the heart"). It is an invitation to the people of God to raise their minds to "things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God."ⁱⁱ This opening dialog between the presider and congregation is found in liturgical prayers from the Church's earliest centuries. Therefore, as we lift up our hearts, with all that is on our hearts (which includes our burdens and cares), we are to remember with thanksgiving all that our Lord has done for us. Then, with liturgical repetition, the celebrant imparts further reasons to do so. For "It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere, to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth."

The importance of beginning your prayers and praises with thanksgiving runs throughout the Psalter. Psalm 92 begins, "It is a good thing to give thanks to the Lord, and to sing praises to your name, O Most High."ⁱⁱⁱ Psalm 100 encourages us to "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and into his courts with praise. Give thanks to him and bless his name."^{iv}

Let us give thanks, not just in this season of the year when the holiday calendar reminds us to do so, but "always and everywhere."
