FROM OUR VICAR

I like to think of my time preparing sermons as my personal expression of worship to God. I admit that sometimes my efforts do not have significant results, and my first drafts are often embarrassing. Yet, I continue in my efforts to worship God through what I do.

The Apostle Paul admonished pastors, “Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.”ⁱ

There is a principle here for all of us. The little acts of worship that we offer to God are never wasted, for if the poor widow, who put into the temple treasury only a coin “worth only a few cents,” which our Lord declared was “greater than all the rest,”ⁱⁱ then certainly, every act of service can be an acceptable expression of worship and loving obedience. Like the widow, we honor God with intentional, generous, and sacrificial gifts, which are most often so small as to go unnoticed. Yet, when given from a thankful heart for all he has given to us, it is always more than enough to please Him, whom we worship and adore.
