Reflections from the Vicar

One of my favorite prayers that I have memorized is called “A Prayer of Self-Dedication.” It was written by William Temple, the Archbishop of Canterbury, during the early part of WWII. You will find it on page 832 in our Prayer Book. It reads, “Almighty and eternal God, so draw our hearts to you, so guide our minds, and so fill our imaginations, so control our wills, that we may be wholly yours, utterly dedicated unto you, and then use us, we pray, as you desire and always to your glory and welfare of your people.”

That prayer was written during some of the darkest days in English history, when Churchill inspired the people with words like, “If you’re going through hell, keep going.” The endurance Churchill stirred required hope and an imagination that could see better days ahead. As Christians, we have a God who has promised to be our Shepherd, who will guide us through dark valleys and empower us to fear no evil.¹

If you are anything like me, using my imagination is not easy. I tend to be a realist, but after taking time with my grandchildren and reading stories with them, I have been inspired to let my imagination grow. Now, I can see why Jesus used parables to shape the imagination in ways that allow people to see with new eyes ways they might take hold of God’s kingdom.
