Vicar's Corner: A

Glorious Hope – Our Advent Theme
Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ushers in the beginning of our Church year. Since Advent means “coming” in Latin, we begin our church year by anticipating and preparing for the coming and birth of Christ on Christmas Eve. But we also remember that during this season, we still wait for the completion of the work begun in Christ, when Christ will come again with power and great glory. In this respect, it is a season of hope. Paul tells us, “For in this hope we are saved.” It, therefore, has a surprising practical effect, imparting an eternal perspective on what is presently happening in our dying world. This hope acts like an anchor that rests deep in the water and prevents us from drifting with the currents, yet it can be raised to sail confidently into the future. The currents of our culture can carry us along swiftly during this season. There is no other season as hurried as the days before Christmas, but that anchor of hope keeps us grounded. One of our Advent hymns expresses this sentiment beautifully, “The Bridegroom is
