 As a Christian, I believe that there really is an evil power in this world and in our lives. Whatever we call it, however we describe it, we've all felt its power at times, and it's almost always found in our relationships with other people. Evil's goal and greatest success is evident when it divides, separates, and alienates us from one another. The power of evil wins whenever we are tempted to see differences between each other as threatening and dangerous instead of the God-given diversity they are. Not a single one of us comes into this world hating black people, or white people, or gay people, or Republicans, or Democrats, or liberals or conservatives, and the list is endless. No, we are taught to hate by other people. At some point in our lives, each of us decided what the truth is for us about these differences, and how we will respond to them. I think we need to remind ourselves and each other that when Jesus talks about loving our neighbor, that includes all of those people I just mentioned, and the many others not on that list. In our present political climate that is, indeed, a significant challenge. With God's help, we can meet it.
